## Chiropractic Massage Therapist Job Description

## **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- Carry out adjustments to the spine or other articulations of the body manually in order to effect correction where necessary to the musculoskeletal system
- Get patients educated as regards the quality of life benefits of routine chiropractic care. Provide a recommended course of treatment
- Maintain several consecutive hours of deep tissue massage
- Provide massages for appointment holders and walk-ins at the facility
- Guide clients through service offerings and help them choose the types of massages that will be most beneficial to them. Design sessions around clients' specific complaints/problem areas
- Listen effectively to clients during massage sessions and adjust technique to meet their needs
- Suggest massage schedules for recurring sessions
- Help injured patients recover from auto and work injuries
- Give general relaxation massages and provide chiropractic care and education
- Evaluate spine-related (axial) neuro-musculoskeletal conditions and non-axial (extremity) conditions
- Diagnose chiropractic conditions
- Utilize chiropractic manipulation and adjustment to restore joint and related soft tissue function
- Obtain and maintain accurate case histories and records of patients
- Analyze X-rays so as to locate the sources of patients' difficulties and to rule out fractures or diseases as sources of problems
- Examine patients' spine and determine nerve function using range of motion, spinal palpation, and orthopedic and neurological tests to determine diagnosis
- X-ray a patient's spine and extremities to confirm the diagnosis and determine a prognosis

- Plan individual chiropractic treatment programs for patients
- Manipulate the spine and extremities of patients
- Instruct patients in a well-planned program of home stretches and exercises
- Utilize a variety of modalities, including inter-segmental, lumbar, and cervical traction, diathermy, cryo-therapy, and ultrasound
- Instruct patients in the use of orthopedic supplies (e.g. cervical pillow, lumbar support, lumbar sacral belt) when necessary
- Work with Chiropractic Assistants and other staff in the provision of treatment to patients
- Respond to report requests by doctors, insurance companies, and lawyers
- Apply the established chiropractic guidelines identified as Guidelines for Chiropractic Quality Assurance and Practice Parameters
- Record every measure of observation that will substantially profile the patient during initial patient interview/ consultation
- Utilize X-ray and standard laboratory tests appropriate to the chiropractic diagnosis and within the MTF's capabilities as detailed by the standard MTF operating procedures
- Perform standard osseous and soft tissue procedures as commonly taught in Chiropractic College
- Plan and execute training programs and lectures for patients, students, and staff on chiropractic related subjects
- Order orthotics, lifts, collars, and lumbar sacral supports if available at the MTF
- Make consultations with patients by reviewing health/medical histories; questioning, observing and examining patients; and reviewing x-rays, as indicated
- Build positive doctor-patient relationships
- Maintaining accurate and timely patient records
- Protect client information and confidentiality
- Maintain professional and clean appearance of the treatment area
- Effectively communicate with clients and staff.

## Chiropractic Massage Therapist Requirements – Skills, Knowledge, and Abilities

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- Education and Training: They require a Bachelor's degree from a college accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education; and a Doctor of Chiropractic degree from an accredited chiropractic college
- Possess ability to obtain current Basic Life Support (BLS) Training and certification sponsored or endorsed by the American Heart Association (AHA) and maintain it
- Knowledge: Chiropractors must have strong knowledge of anatomy, physiology, biology, and similar subjects. They also require clinical experience in which they are trained and supervised in spinal assessment, spinal adjustment techniques, and diagnosis
- Licenses: They must possess a current, full, active, and unrestricted license to practice as a doctor of chiropractic
- Decision-making skills: They require sound judgment to determine the best course of action when treating a patient, and to decipher when to refer patients to other health care professionals
- Detail orientation: They require a detail orientation in documenting observations, making proper diagnosis, and analyzing x-ray reports when necessary
- Manual Dexterity: They should be energetic to perform their job, which
  requires the use of hands to perform manual adjustments to the spine
  and other joints. They will also be frequently required to stand and reach
  with hands and arms for prolonged period of time.
- Empathy: They must be understanding and sympathetic to their patients' problems and needs
- Interpersonal skills: They must be personable to influence clients to complete their therapy schedule and to put their patients at ease during procedures. They need interpersonal skills to build doctor-patient relationship skills
- Communication skills- They require clear and concise communication skills to communicate with clients at initial interview; to educate them and provide relevant counsel to them. It is also important to communicate clearly with other assistants
- Listening skills: Their job involves the evaluation and management of patients, hence it is important for them to develop active listening skills to be able get the most from interviews with their patients
- Team spirit: They must be able to work with other people

Excellent clinical skills: They require clinical skills to administer both
diagnostic and treatment services. They also need knowledge of rehab
exercise, and soft tissue techniques
