- Arrange information into report format and for the preparation of graphical establishments of research results
- Make use of available resources to maximize profit
- Provide technical inputs and analyses in the identification, design, development, processing, and evaluation of loan projects
- Develop and transfer knowledge products for capacity building on economic methods and principles
- Work closely with the managers of private or public organization and government agencies to know their needs and establish a scale of preference in the process.
