Occupational Therapy Assistant Job Description

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Responsible for maintaining patients' occupational therapy records by recording the rate of progress of the client for use by the therapist
- Help in educating patients on how to make use of their rehabilitation and/or treatment equipment at home
- Consult the rehabilitation team to select an effective activity or program for patient
- Verify patient information by interviewing them, reviewing and recording patients' medical background/history, and confirming the purpose of treatment
- Assist patients in going through their rehabilitation process and treatment procedures as suggested by the occupational therapist
- Help in feeding patients, clothing them, and generally ensuring that their surroundings are always clean
- Place orders and carry out required maintenance of equipment used in the process of treating patients
- Provide medications for patients as prescribed by the doctor or occupational therapist in charge
- Monitor patients to actually understand their health challenges and make sure that they receive every form of support they need
- Protect the occupational therapy practice by sticking to professional standards, policies, and procedures
- Update occupational knowledge by taking part in professional organizations and reading professional work-related publications
- Keep comprehensive records of billing information of services rendered, thereby enhancing the organization's revenue.

Occupational Therapy Assistant Requirements – Skills, Knowledge, and Abilities

- He/she must have excellent communication ability. There might be also need for extra communication abilities that will help the patients at their different points of need; this may include sign language and facial expressions
- Must be an individual that is highly tolerant, patient, and understanding when dealing with patients
- He/she must have excellent interpersonal skills and must be an easygoing person that is approachable and friendly at all times. This will help patients in overcoming their challenges and generally in their recovery process
- Must have excellent analytical and problem-solving abilities
- Must have the ability to discern patients' needs in a situation whereby they cannot clearly communicate their needs
- Must be someone that pays keen attention to every single detail that has to do with patients
- Must display a high level of flexibility when dealing with patients. This is because the needs of patients certainly differ and require different approaches or solutions
- Knowledge of equipment and methods used in occupational therapy
- Must be a graduate of occupational therapy assistant program
- A minimum of 2 years on-the-job experience in a similar role
- Necessary certification as an occupational therapy assistant within the area/locality of practice.
