

# Pressure Wash Technician Job Description

---

- Consult with customers on-site to inspect surfaces and discuss project scopes, problem areas, and desired outcomes before providing quotes
- Select suitable pressure levels, nozzles, and cleaning solutions depending on surface material, such as wood, brick, concrete, or vinyl to avoid damage
- Set up equipment including power washers, hoses, ladders, caution signs, and drainage control according to safety procedures before starting
- Mask or otherwise protect windows, landscaping, vehicles, or other stationary items near cleaning areas from water spray or debris dispersion
- Clean grounds or work areas of loose debris that could interfere with pressure washing surfaces
- Apply degreasing agents, mold removers, or other preparatory chemical solutions on surfaces where needed allowing enough dwell time before power washing
- Adjust nozzles, pressure levels, spray angles, and soap reservoirs on power washers ensuring safe and optimized settings
- Maneuver spray wands and nozzles methodically across surfaces to lift off layers of dirt, oil, rust stains, mildew and other difficult buildup
- Redirect wastewater drainage where possible using berms, hay bales, or trenches to limit environmental hazards
- Rinse cleaned areas thoroughly to eliminate any remaining debris or chemical residue
- Apply protective treatments like water sealants to exterior wood, brickwork, or other porous surfaces at customer request
- Clean, inspect, and perform routine maintenance on all pressure wash equipment according to manufacturer guidelines before storage

- Photograph project sites before and after work is completed to showcase quality of service delivered
- Generate itemized invoices listing services rendered, equipment fees, supplies, and labor rates for billing approval by customers
- Adhere to all state and local regulations regarding pressure wash containment, disposal of wastewater, or application of chemical cleaning products
- Participate in safety meetings and continuing education to stay current with equipment best practices, environmental codes, and hazards awareness
- Inventory, restock, or procure cleaning solutions, safety gear, spare parts, fuel, and other operational supplies needed for jobs
- Create estimate quotes and schedule new pressure wash jobs via client management software tracking leads and customer data
- Train junior staff members in worksite set up, equipment usage, safety protocols, and washing techniques as needed
- Transport power wash equipment and supplies securely using trucks or trailers moving between storage facilities and job sites.
