Duties and Responsibilities:

- Attend games, training sessions, and press conferences to report on live sporting events, including pre-game, during-game, and post-game coverage
- Report on sensitive issues within sports, such as sexism, racism, corruption, and doping in sports as required in investigative journalism
- Handle sensitive topics and rumors, and ensure accuracy, fairness, and balance while valuing privacy
- Provide exceptional analysis, insights, and commentary on player performance, sports events, and future trends
- Interview athletes, coaches, and other sports figures to get fashionable information, news stories, and features
- Build and maintain relationships with contacts in the sports industry to assist the collection of information
- Research, write, and edit articles, opinion pieces, game recaps, and feature stories for digital platforms or print to produce quality content
- Work in collaboration with editors, producers, other team members like journalists and photographers to create content and meet deadlines
- Work under pressure by balancing various assignments and delivering content quickly while maintaining high quality
- Create multimedia content for diverse platforms, including podcasts and videos, and maintain a solid social media presence
- Stay informed with the latest sports news, developments, and trends to ensure relevant and timely reporting
- Make use of basic quotes from interviews conducted on athletes and coaches to include uniqueness in a story
- Conduct deep and general research into player history, league developments, and the wider impact of sports on athletes' health
- Craft compelling narratives and feature stories that go beyond the basic game report, and provide context through basic team history, statistics, and scores

Sports Reporter Requirements - Skills, Knowledge, and Abilities

- **Storytelling and Creativity Skills:** Creativity is what differentiates a good sports reporter from a mediocre. Sports reporters must develop the ability to highlight personal struggles, stories, and triumphs of athletes or teams, paint pictures with words to make the reader feel like they are part of the action, and include historical moments to give readers a deeper understanding.

With exceptional communication skills, sports reporters can get the most accurate and useful information, while also promoting trust within the sports environment.
- Passion for Sports: Sports reporters must have a deep passion for sports if they want to succeed in this profession. This passion creates the zeal and curiosity that their job requires to follow the action both on and off the pitch. For sports reporters to cultivate passion they have to keep up with various sports and leagues to understand the difficulties of different games, and explore how top sports journalists cover various events and analyze their writing styles.
- Attention to Detail and Accuracy: Being accurate will make fans believe in you as a sports reporter for the exact information they need. Accuracy involves telling the truth and avoiding the tendency to frame a story. This will help maintain your credibility as a sports reporter and help you stay organized. Sports reporters must keep track of important facts and dates and rely on official statements, team reports, and trusted analysis for accurate information.
- **Deep Knowledge of Sports:** Sports reporting requires a deep understanding of sports and not just about writing headlines or announcing results. As a good sports reporter, you need to know the history, unique terminology, rules, and strategies of the sports that you

- are covering. With this knowledge, you can add depth to your stories and ensure that they can accurately convey the significance of performances, events, and strategies.

They must be able to deliver stories quickly while ensuring that they don't forfeit quality, and also adapt to sudden changes during events, such as weather delays, last-minute injuries, and rule changes.
- Network Building: It's important for sports reporters to build a strong network by attending sporting events and conferences to interact with other industry professionals and build solid relationships with them.
