

Tire Technician Job Description

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Studs tires in preparation for snow, and also in anticipation of weather change
- Performs experiments on tires to confirm their durability and possible cause of failure
- Recommends tires for use by clients in light of the tires' durability and fitness for the clients' specific purpose
- Recommends to clients good driving and tire maintenance practices
- Ensures that minimum standard of safety is maintained in the technician's office
- Retreads tires which previously have been labeled off the road tires
- Maintains a clean office area that meets minimum environmental requirements' regulations
- Ensures appropriate dismounting and mounting of tires
- Sells tires to clients.

Tire Technician Requirements – Skills, Knowledge, and Abilities

- A minimum of High School Diploma, but having a certification course in tire technology is considered an edge
- Possess physical strength to be able to lift heavy items
- A valid driver's license and a good record of driving
- Effective interpersonal and proven customer service skills
- Strong ability to communicate effectively both in writing and orally
- Good marketing, persuasion, and problem-solving skills
- Proven time management, organization, and time management skills, as well as exceptional ability to work effective within a team setting
- Ability to display professionalism, maintain quality focus, and pay attention to detail
- Strong ability to work with computers and the necessary applications, including Microsoft Excel, Word, etc.
- Technical knowledge of tire production and repair technology is a must.
